Proclamation

CONSTITUTION OBSERVANCE MONTH

One of the truly magnificent moments in recorded history took place on September 17, 1787, when thirty-nine delegates from thirteen struggling states signed the Constitution of the United States of America.

My Brethren, we must never forget that it is this document which delivers into the hands of the citizens . . . allof the citizens . . . the right of democratic self-determination and guarantees to each citizen basic rights desired by all, and at the same time, reserves to the people the power and responsibility for government.

At this moment in America's history, it is essential that all of us, including the "silent majority" be reminded of what has thus far been accomplished and that the future depends upon our continued dedication to those principles set forth in the Constitution.

For nearly three decades the Masons of California and Hawaii have sponsored patriotic programs to stimulate thought and endeavor on the part of all citizens to maintain and preserve the blessing of liberty. This year we join with our fellow citizens in celebrating the one hundred eighty-second anniversary. Let us do so with an equal measure of reverence and enthusiasm.

I, therefore, proclaim September to be Constitution Observance Month, and direct every Lodge in this jurisdiction to commemorate our Constitution with a public observance held on a date as close as possible to the anniversary date of September 17th.

This proclamation shall be read at the September stated meetings of every constituent Lodge, and whereever possible, it shall be reprinted in the Lodge bulletin.

JOSEPHUS . . .

What do we know about Josephus, the Jewish historiand From his own writings which have survived nineteen centuries, we have learned quite a bit about the man and his character. He took a prominent and individual part in the Jewish War with the Romans, and enjoyed talking about himself. He wrote an autobiography.

Born a slave as Joseph ben Matthias, he later took his master's name, Flavius Josephus, upon the occasion of receiving his freedom. He was born in A.D. 37, the year of Caligula's accession, and lived to be 63 years of age. He was by birthright a priest, and on his mother's side the descendant of kings. He was a precocious child and his education was continued until he was nineteen. He was destined to become a politician, soldier, orator, and historian. His earlier years were spent in his own country but at the age of 27 he visited Rome on a mission to the Imperial Government. This was in the year 64 A.D., the year in which Nero watched the burning of Rome. He gained a good reputation and two years later he was made Governor of Galilee. He served the Romans with unswerving devotion and at the end of the Jewish War he became a Roman citizen and Imperial pensioner. He accepted from Vespasian, the revenues of land confiscated from his unfortunate countrymen. He settled down in an apartment set aside for him in the Emperor's house, divorced the mother of his sons, and wed an heiress. The rest of his life was spent writing successful works which were primarily intended to show that the Romans were right in their actions, and that he, in going over to their side, was still a loyal Jew.


Four of his works have come down to us, and generally it is agreed that they were published in the following order: THE JEWISH WAR, ANTIQUITIES OF THE IEWS. LIFE, and AGAINST APION. THE JEWISH WAR is reportedy the most interesting of his writings. He writes in a "blood and thunder" style, and is not above exagerating somewhat to make a good story. Historians generaly agree his accounts of events in which he played no personal part, are generally accurate, as the facts for these events were largev obtained from Roman military records and other official documents. Accounts from his own experiences, however, must be read critically, as he has contradicted himself in writing of the same event in different volumes of his writings. He moralizes over the tragedy of his nation, proclaiming that, "it is just what those abominable Jews deserved." He expressed no disapproval of the atrocities committed by the Romans on the Jews, such as the throwing of living, fettered men into the Dead Sea by way of scientific experiment, or the butchering of thousands of Jews who were infirm, and selling into slavery those who were physicaly sound.

However, his writings were aimed primarily at the Romans for their consumption, and because many of his contemporaries were also eye witnesses to some of the events recorded, he was obliged to be accurate in anything that could be proven. His works are important to us as sources of information in addition to the Gospels. Read with a critical eye they can tell us much of the life and times of the period.
