

Some Masonic Facts About George Washington . . .

He was initiated November 4, 1752, passed March 3, 1753 and raised August 4, 1753. He became charter Master of Alexandria Lodge, Va. April 28, 1788 and was elected Master December 20, 1788. He took the oath of office as president on the Bible of St. Johns Lodge, N.Y., and laid the cornerstone of the Capitol, Washington, D.C. on Sept. 18, 1793.

He was buried with Masonic ceremony by Alexandria Lodge No. 39 and Brooks Lodge No. 47 Dec. 18, 1799.
