Your officers are picking up degree work again after being dark for a month. They deserved a well earned rest. I hope you will make the endeavor to visit with us now and then before the year closes.


To those who have not as yet paid their 1970 dues and there are 73 who have not, out of our total membership; please do so now as it is very important to you and your lodge that you do so.
