BY-LAWG AMENDMENT

At the stated meeting of Dec. 18 a motion was presented to increase the initiation fee from \$80.00 to \$100 to meet a 10% rent raise starting

in February.

To accomplish this it will be necessary to change the By-Laws. At our stated meeting of January 15, 1976, a vote will be taken to amend Section VIII, Article 1, of the By-Laws, to read:

Section 1. The table of fees for this lodge shall be as follows: for the three degrees, the sum of \$100 (one hundred); for the degrees of Fellow Craft and Master Mason, when the first degree shall have been received in another Lodge, the sum of 30% (thirty percent for each of the two degrees); for the degrees of Master Mason, when the first and second degrees shall have been received in another Lodge, the sum of 30% (thirty percent) of the full amount.

Members wishing to speak for or against the proposed change, or who wish to vote for or against it, are urged to be present.

Bro. Dan Winters has done it again. We are all grateful to Dan for his rendition of the "Steam Roller" talk at our last Stated Meeting. His presentation of this inspirational talk was excellent, it bears repeating, it's good food for thought.
