From the Secretary

Members are moving to other addresses and are not notifying the lodge of their new mailing addresses. We have seven such names of members who we cannot find. Mail comes back so there is no point in continuing to send correspondence to these persons. They will not receive the trestleboard or the California Freemason.

We have a list of forty-two members who have not yet paid their 1977 dues. In a short time they will be suspended for non-payment of dues unless they repond. Dues reminders are sent out every three months and postage is wasted. Our By-Laws are very explicit about dues. They are payable on the first on January every year, if a member so desires he can pay quarterly on the first day of January. April, July and October if for any reason he cannot pay annually. It is hard to understand why some members pay dues when the year is almost over. They probably don't remember what they promised when they were at the altar in the third dearee.

The brethren are reminded that dues bills for 1978 will be in an envelope with the November Trestleboard. We get all kinds of excuses about not getting a bill, or the bill has been lost. Evidently some are not opening their mail from the lodge. The bill will be an envelope furnished by the Masonic Homes Endowment Committee free of charge to the lodge. It is printed with blue ink and we have stamped the amount of dues for 1978 on the face of it. The outside of the envelope is addressed back to the lodge to minimize the workload in mailing. Wives of members, and sometimes their office secretaries, should be alerted to watch for these bills and immediately make out a check, including a donatin to the Masonic Homes, and see that it gets into the mail before the first of January.
