Time is drawing near when applications for scholarship grants, made by the California Masonic Foundation, must be submitted. Students desiring to apply for grants to attend college classes starting in September should submit their applications before June 30. Those entering advance

studies in February should apply before November 30.

Funds from which these college grants are made have accrued from sale of two student centers, one at the University of California, and the other at the University of Southern California; also from the sale of a hospital formerly owned by the Order of Amaranth in southern California.

Applications can be received from any student now enrolled in or about to enroll in certain prescribed courses, and who have maintained a 3.5 grade average in their former studies.

Further information on making application for financial assistance may be obtained by calling the lodge office any morning during the week or writing to Las Palmas Lodge at 2992 East Clinton, Fresno, CA 93703.

Applicants must be in need of assistance, and by enrolling in college it would create a hardship on the family of such student. Funds from the above-named sources must be expended each year in order to maintain a tax-free status. Some years this has been difficult.

If you know of a young person needing help, please let them know of the availability of theses grants.
