ADVISORY BOARD OF LAS PALMAS CHAPTER, ORDER OF DeMOLAY

Bob Stinecipher, membership advisor of the chapter is seeking to compile a list of at least 100 boys whom the boys can contact and invite to a "Prospect" night and explain the advantages and rewards for belonging to an organized youth group.

There are probably prospective DeMolays in nearly every family of members of this lodge. Neighbors may also have sons of the proper age who should be members. Grand-children and children of members should be asked to join. They may have school friends who will join with them. There really is no end to the source of DeMolay members.

Every member is asked to search their neighborhood, their relatives and friends for names of boys, preferably ages 13 to 16 and submit the list to the lodge office together with an address of the boy or his telephone number. The secretary will see that he is contacted by the Chapter membership committee and invited to the Prospect Party. The boy can then make up his own mind if he wishes to join.

We all should give the boys an opportunity to decide if they wish to join this honorable fraternity of young men. In the past about 60 per cent of the DeMolay membership have petitioned the lodge for membership after they reach the age of 21. The boys do not have to be from masonic families. All are eligible to submit applications for membership regardless of religion or race or creed.

Las Palmas Chapter needs the members and the boys need to be members. They will thank you for your thoughtfulness in recommending them some day. DeMolay may not keep them out of trouble, but it will teach them some of the rules of righteous living.
