VAHAN RUDOLPH TASHJIAN, age 93, passed away August 23. He was discovered early Saturday morning murdered by a beating, supposedly by burglars. He lived by himself, his wife having preceded him in death several years previously. Vahan was raised in Standard Lodge No. 873 in Illinois, which later consolidated under the name of Cornerstone Lodge No. 875, on March 31, 1921. He affiliated from the latter lodge March 21, 1974 and received a Golden Veterans Award the following year.

RICHARD OLAF OLSON, age 71, died October 25, a suicide, following a few years' battle with bone marrow cancer. It seems the pain became unbearable. Before he retired Dick was advertising manager for the Fresno Guide. He later sold reas estate. For about ten years he was in hospitals for treatment of his affliction, which was never completely controlled and became progressively worse. He was born in Beloit, Wisconsin on July 23, 1911, and came to Fresno in his early thirties. Las Palmas Lodge anducted the funeral service October 28, will J. Craig Shaw and Eldon W. Cole officiating.
