Brethren:

It seems to me that a great many of those Masons who have been around for a while, been active in their Blue Lodge, joined other bodies and have lived and practiced the tenets of the Fraternity, have forgotten something that they themselves, in most cases experienced.

I believe they are guilty of not profiting from their own experiences. It seems that we take for granted, when a new Brother has been raised into the Order, that he will automatically be blessed with the ability to appreciate and understand at its fullest value all that he has been exposed to.

Think about it for a moment. Did you grasp it? Was it all clear to you? Were you then and there a just and upright Mason? I don't think so. It took a while for you to realize the true meaning of Masonry — its fundamentals.

Masonry is veiled and cryptic. Yet it is so easy to grasp if the veil is removed. The full significance of our beautiful yet shrouded ritual is hidden to many. The lessons taught are both scientific and spiritual. Understanding of it takes time and guidance, together with a sincere desire for knowledge.

Not infrequently Brethren lose interest because Masonry means nothing to them. No explanation has been given or offered to them.

The ability to understand the Masonic System and to reduce it to all that it implies, is not and has not been easy for many, it remains a mystery. It becomes complicated by the prose of allegory. The ability to translate to day-to-day practice is often lacking.

Masonry must be accepted at its face value. The rules are there. Maybe they are obscured because they are so easy. Maybe because they have been heard since childhood, at home, at church, at school, everywhere; so much so that perhaps they are overlooked, their importance diminished by constant repetition. Yet it is by this very repetition that the fundamentals are firmly set. The process of repetition of thought and deed becomes deeply ingrained in the mind. often subconsciously. It might be well to pick up a monitor and read the charges of each of the Degrees and begin all over. Repeat the obligations a few times. Substitute your own words for the symbols, reduce the ambiguous to matter of fact, and you have in the palm of your hand.
