remodelled our kitchen with the installation of new appliances. Our old Kitchen was installed when the temple was built in 1961, and while it gave us many years of service, it was just plain worn out. Your temple association felt that Mary's request was not out of line, and we approved the purchase and installation of about \$18,000 in new appliances, consisting of a new 10 burner range with double ovens below, a double stack of convection ovens, and a fully automatic coffee maker. The installation of this equipment will make cooking our monthly meals easier, and greatly improve the flexibility of our kitchen.

Hope to see you at this month's dinner so that you may see and experience first-hand the culinary results of our beautiful new facility. And while you're at it, don't forget to thank Mary for her many years of service to our Lodge. Without her, there would be no Stated Meeting dinners!!!

NEWS FROM THE OFFICE

Not all our members understand that the lodge office is open week-days until noon. We keep getting complaints that no one answers the phone at 12:45 pm. If you want to be sure to reach the secretary, make your call before noon. Occasionally, if there is nothing doing in the office, we leave a little before lunch time so we can get to the bank, purchase supplies, deliver mail to the main post office or do other errands and still get something to eat before too late in the afternoon.

We are going to try and have dues notices ready to go into the mail when the November Trestleboard is ready to be delivered. If we enclose the dues notice and Trestleboard in one envelope and mail them together, we can save a little over \$50.00 in postage. Be sure to examine your mail carefully so we won't get complaints that the dues notice was never received.

It should not be necessary to send dues notices. This matter is covered in the By-Laws, where it can be found that dues are due and payable on or before January 1 each year. We know some members wish to have something in front of them when they make out a check, so we issue reminders.

The Grand Lodge committee for the Masonic Homes Endowment Fund furnishes envelopes free of charge to the lodge, which we use as dues notices. They can be used to return your payment to the lodge. They are addressed to the Secretary and all that is necessary is to paste on a stamp and enclose your check for \$30.00 and the job is done for another year.

One of our problems is keeping a current address on some members. Some of your mail is returned because we weren't notified when you moved. Grand Lodge spends several thousand dollars every time the California Freemason is sent out because they do not have your correct address. We get nasty letters from the Grand Secretary quite frequently on this subject. He thinks we are not doing our job right.

Hope you are all enjoying this wonderful cool fall weather. Kind of makes a person want to attend lodge occasionally, doesn't it.
