From the Secretary

It might be well to discuss procedures of receiving members in a lodge. Not all members have access to the California Masonic Code and are not aware of what must take place when an applicant submits an application for degrees.



An application is received when it is read by the secretary at a stated meeting, unless by a majority vote the lodge declines to receive it.

The Master then appoints a committee of three members, whose duty it is to make strict examination into the moral, mental, physical and other proper qualifcations of the applicant, and report thereon to the Master at the next stated meeting, unless further time be granted.

The report of the investigating committee shall be made in detail, giving the fact ascertained respecting the applicant and the conclusion of the committee, which shall be read to the lodge.

If the report of the committee, or any member thereof, be unfavorable, or if said report shows that an applicant is in any way not qualified to be made a mason, no ballot shall be had, but the Master shall declare the applicant rejected.

If the investigating committee finds the applicant disqualified because of insufficient residence or physical or mental disability, or if his application was received within twelve months after his rejection by a lodge, the Master may direct withdrawal of the application. If the applicant moves from this Grand jurisdiction after filing his application it may be withdrawn if the applicant so desires and the lodge consents.

Every member of the lodge, when present, must vote upon a ballot for the degrees or affiliation. No one is permitted to enter or retire from the lodge room during a ballot except for sickness or other imperative reason.

Before a ballot is taken there may be discussion of the qualifications of the applicant as may seem proper. If the ballot box is not properly prepared, the Master must rectify the error and have a proper ballot taken.

If one cube appears, the Master without declaring the result, shall order another ballot to correct a possible mistake. No discussion shall be had before the second ballot is taken.
