# From the Secretary

The Grand Lodge of California and Hawaii maintains two homes for the benefit of members of this jurisdiction and has vested the powers of maintaining and admission to the homes in a Board of Directors, which has incorporated and



has become a separate organization, or governing board.

We have recently receiveved inquiries about admission to the Home for adults at Union City. Now would be a good time to explain some of the requirements.

In order to be eligible for admission as a resident, the applicant must be (a) A master mason in good standing in a lodge in this jurisdiction continuously for the past five years. (b) The wife of such master mason. (c) The widow of master mason in good standing at the time of his death for the previous five years. (d) The mother of a master mason under the same conditions as (a) and (c) above.

The applicant must be in need of financial assistance, available for a medical examination, willing to abide by the rules of the Home, willing to assign all assets including social security and insurance policies to the Masonic Homes, be of good character and free from mental illness, contagious diseases, not addicted to drugs or alcohol and meet the physical requirements designated by the State of California.

Children who can afford to assist their mother or father will be expected to do so or admission will be denied. The Home does not

accept paying residents.

In some cases the governing board may award financial assistance to an eligible person so they can live in a convalescent home mear their family, this is called outside aid and is applied for the smae as admission to the Home.

Inquiries for admission to the Home should be made through the secretary of the lodge to which the husband is or was a member. He will then request necessary application forms from the Masonic Homes office. The Master of that lodge will then appoint a committee to assist the applicant. The lodge will then determine if the person is qualified and if so, will send the application to the Homes office for action. This will probably require several months for processing and the applicant will be notified when to enter the Home.
