Only reserve enough spaces at each table that you need for you and your guests. This will open up seats for those who must come late for some reason or another. If you cannot find a place to sit please contact the Master or one of the Wardens and a table will be set up for you. These dinners can be used for the purpose of fellowship and making new friends or just getting to know someone a little better. Thank you Brethren for your much needed and appreciated support in this matter.

I would like to congratulate the Scholarship Award Winners of May 15th. At our Stated Meeting we awarded four scholarships out of nine applicants. It was a difficult choice to make. All of the applicants were well deserving. We urge you to keep up the good work.
