
fantastic. Worshipful Sherrod could not attend due to health issues with his mother.





By the time you receive this newsletter Sharon Temple's main fall event, the Fashion Show Luncheon, will be over. Everyone has been working hard to make it a success. I will write all about it in the next newsletter.

Our next meeting on November 11th is Founder's Night. The Daughters of the Nile was founded on October 30th, 1913. It was formed for the purpose of character building, social recreation, and advancement of women. The principles of the Order still stand; and today we put them into practice by assisting the Shriners in helping the children of the Shriners Hospitals. Sharon Temple No. 92 started out as Nile Club No. 1 of Islam Temple No. 25 in 1946. After Tehran Temple Shrine was on instituted on November 6, 1948, the Supreme Queen of Daughters of the Nile had a representative from Islam Temple come and talk to the Nile Club about becoming a Temple Daughters of the Nile. Sharon Temple No. 92 U.D. was instituted on November 29, 1946. The name "Sharon was taken from the Bible, meaning level country – the Plain extending from Joppa to Mt. Carmel. The Sacred Oak flourishes there – the land is richly cultivated. In early spring the luxuriant grass and richly colored flowers render this Plain the Garden of Palestine," Due to the similarity between this Plain and our own San Joaquin Valley, the name was chosen out of a slate of five names, by a majority of voting members. After Tehran Temple received its charter Sharon Temple No. 92 was constituted on October 1, 1949.

As we go through our daily lives let us treat each other with kindness and speak kindly to one another. People may not remember your words but they will remember how you made them feel.

Greetings from the Archives



Recently I have had the honor of being the Funeral Master at several Masonic Funerals. Our Masonic Funeral ritual says "Seeing then, my brethren, that life is so uncertain. . . let us no longer postpone the all-important concern of preparing for eternity. . ." To me, this statement has two meanings. The first being spiritual, the second seeing that your final wishes are carried out.

Recently a member of our Lodge passed away and while he had told some of his family that he wanted a Masonic Funeral, he did not tell all of them. The ones that made his funeral arrangements did not know of his wishes and his wishes were not followed. After practicing law for many years I discovered that even if you make your wishes known to all of your family there is no guarantee that they will be followed. It is acceptable for you to spend your money on your final wishes, but once you pass on, it is your heir's money that will be used. The moral is make your plans in advance and pay for them in advance.

As one of your Lodge Trustees it is my duty to regularly report to the members, at our Stated Meetings, the state of our Lodge assets. If you have heard one of these reports you know that I always mention that the Lodge has several cemetery plots at both Belmont Memorial Park and Fresno Memorial Gardens. These plots were acquired by the Lodge as a gift many years ago with the hope that a member would need them for himself or his immediate family.

At our most recent Stated Meeting the Lodge voted to sell these plots at a greatly discounted price with the first opportunity given to members. We have 4 adjacent plots at Fresno Memorial Gardens in the Acacia (Masonic) section that the cemetery values at \$3,800 each. The Lodge voted to sell these to members for \$1,250 each or all for \$4,000. We also have a total of 3 plots at Belmont Memorial Park. One plot is located in the south side of the cemetery and a member can purchase it for only \$500. The remaining 2 plots are in the Masonic section and can be purchased for \$750 each. All of these plots can be used for a casket burial or the burial of up to 2 cremated remains.

If you are a member of Las Palmas-Ponderosa Lodge, or a widow or child of a member, you are eligible to make this purchase. Please contact the Lodge Secretary (559) 268-2303 so that he can get you in contact with me. If you have any questions, I will be happy to answer them for you.

We also have our Las Palmas-Ponderosa burial section at Mountain View Cemetery for cremated remains. In this section there is a large granite marker with the Lodge's name. This section is available free of charge (except for a \$450 fee to the cemetery) to members and their immediate family on an as needed basis. Pre-selected spots can also be reserved in advance for a modest fee to the Lodge.

If you have any questions or if you desire to look into purchasing one of these plots, or reserving a place in our Lodge burial plot, simply contact Brother Jim Clark, our Lodge Secretary, and he will get you in contact with me.




