Greetings from the East



Greetings from the South



Hello to Everyone from Legacy No. 555 Order of Eastern Star

The "warm" summer days have arrived and our thoughts have turned to staying cool and hydrated, BUT...

DO NOT DRINK BOTTLED WATER THAT HAS BEEN LEFT IN A CAR!!!

Heat reacts with the chemicals in the plastic of the bottle which releases dioxin into the water. Dioxin is a toxin increasingly found in cancer tissue, especially breast cancer. Dioxins are highly poisonous to cells in our bodies.

Also, don't freeze plastic bottles with water in them as this also releases dioxins from the plastic.

Do not heat food in the microwave using plastic containers, this especially applies to foods that contain fat. The combination of fat, high heat and plastic releases dioxin into the food. Instead, use glass, such as Pyrex or ceramic containers for heating food ... You get the same result but without the dioxin.

So, such things as TV dinners, instant soups, etc., should be removed from their containers and heated in something else. Paper isn't bad, but you don't know what is in the paper. It's safer to used tempered glass, ceramic dishes, etc.

Not too long ago some of the fast food restaurants moved away from the styrene foam containers to paper. The dioxin problem is one of the reasons they did this.

Plastic wrap, such as Cling Film, is just as dangerous when placed over foods to be cooked in the microwave. As the food is nuked, the high heat causes poisonous toxins to actually melt out of the plastic wrap and drip into food. Cover food with a paper towel instead.

Walter Reed Army Medical Center says:

NO plastic containers in the microwaves

NO plastic water bottles in the freezer

NO plastic wrap in microwaves

I just thought it would be nice to remind everyone about this, I know I'm paying attention.



From the Archives



Leonard "Len" Gottner was our Master in 1968. He is also the Senior Living Past Master of Las Palmas Lodge, having held this honor since 2010. For those of you who remember Len, he still lives in the State of Washington and is very active in both his Blue Lodge as well as Eastern Star. His wife, Frances, passed away several years ago.

From January of 1967 until December of that year, the Lodge membership had shrunk by 10 members to 1057. (One of these was my father who passed away in March.)

On Wednesday January 3, 1968, Center Lodge No. 465 was the first Masonic Lodge to hold a meeting in the new Masonic Temple on

Shields Ave. This Temple was to be occupied by Fresno Lodge No. 247 and Sun Garden No.530 as well as other Masonic bodies. The Temple was dedicated on February 10 by Grand Master Eugene S. Hopp.

On January 25, Lodge was opened in the 2nd degree and I and Brother Edward Lee Esheim were passed to the degree of Fellow Craft. The Sr. Deacon for this degree was Richard Hopper (now a Past Grand Master). At the conclusion of the degree, three brothers were examined as to the Candidate's Proficiency of the 2nd degree.

On February 8, three brothers were examined as to the Candidate's lecture of the 3rd degree of Masonry. After completing this accomplishment, they were presented with Masonic Bibles. Today we present a Masonic Bible to a brother on the night that he is made a Master Mason. I wonder if this has anything to do with the fact that today so few Brothers ever give their 3rd degree proficiency.
