The Las Palmas Masonic Building Association has been working on many changes in the Banquet Room kitchen, after approval by the Board of Directors, and approval of the Lodge to supply Trustee funds to purchase convention ovens and a stove.

Stuart Hoskins whose expertise in this area ordered the ovens at a cost of \$6,600. 87.

Upon arrival, Stuart with the help of Bill Lyons and Josh Crane and other members removed the ovens and Stuart haul them away. Bill Lyons rewired for the ovens, with that the new ovens with Stuart and several brothers got them set-up in the kitchen. The stove was ordered by Stuart at a cost of \$4,166.00. Last Sunday the 19th of February with Josh Crane and others remove the old stove and in with the new, still needs some sheet metal work and plumbing which Stuart tells me he will take care of.

We are truly blessed to have Stuart Hoskins as he is plant manger at Fresno Pacific University with many talents he has applied at our facility.

Bill Lyons retired Chief Engineer for Kaiser Hospital System in Fresno, multiple talented as well, continues to make many changes with his electrician expertise and general skills.

Josh Crane a retired Army Veteran and talented in many fields, he is always there in our time of need.

As well as many more Past Masters and Brothers who have helped with making our facility the best in Masonry!

These Brothers with help from others have accomplished many projects. Will attempt to list a few

- Rewired the foyer and entry installed sensors in foyer.
- Totally reorganized the up stairs room with new shelving and lighting after a thorough cleaning!.
- Redid the card room, updated with Clovis Lodge book cases, memorabilia and pictures.
- Redid the Mens restroom storage area with new shelving after a much needed reorganizing and clean up.
- Repaired the drainage in the parking lot.
- Rewired the no.1 service room, plumbed for the ice maker and move all the refrigerators and freezer and removed all the old shelving and add new.

 Added the boxes in the lodge room with the stained glass from Clovis Lodge, wired the electrical.

- Repaired and serviced the faucets in the restrooms.
- Moved to the foyer from Clovis Masonic Center with a lot of help, the soda machine, repaired and serviced the machine now in good working order.
- Richard Frey has spent countless hours on our web page and lodge history as well as in the card room, redoing our Past Masters pictures, Framing and hanging the Past Masters pictures from Clovis Lodge with help from Brother Ehorn. They also repair the stage curtain, replacing all the cord.

Our facility has seen many changes in the last couple of years, new parking lot LED lighting, all lighting in the building replaced with LED

lighting and of course our soar project was completed.





From the Archives



My monthly article in the Las Palms-Ponderosa Trestle Board will now be talking about my personal contacts with Masonry and Las Palmas Lodge.

During my father's funeral, (March, 1967) I was impressed with the fact that so many of his friends were wearing aprons. Several months later I approached my Uncle Royal, who was a Mason, and asked him if he would go over to Las Palmas Lodge and get me an application. At the time I thought that much of Masonry was secretative and that I could not go into the Lodge building and ask for a petition. Several days later Uncle Royal called me and told me that he had my petition. He also explained how I needed two members of Las Palmas Lodge to sign the petition as well as two friends.

My barber, Ralph Manfredo was a member of Las Palmas and getting his signature was not a problem. Getting the second signature of a member was, however, a problem. One of my father's employees was a Mason in Kansas and somehow he found Amil Brodersen who was a member of Las Palmas who knew my dad and was willing to sign my petition. I remember when Amil was in the process of signing my petition; he had a problem in answering the question "How long have you known the applicant?" He thought for a few seconds and then said, "I don't know you, but I have known your father for over 10 years so I will put down 10 years." Getting the signatures of the two friends was not a problem as one was an ophthalmologist who was a family friend and the other was my urologist who treated me for kidney stones.

The application process for Masonry in California Lodges has changed a lot since my petition in 1967. I later learned that I could have met with the Lodge Secretary who would have loaned me a book with all of the member's names in an attempt to find someone in the list that I knew and would sign the petition.

Today we invite prospective applicants to "break bread" with us on several occasions so that we can get to know them. The brethren who get to know the applicant at these meals then sign his petition, however, the top line signer is supposed know the applicant by, perhaps, visiting the applicant at his home and meeting his family.
