

Greetings from the East



Recently Lisa and I took a day trip up into the mountains. The fine weather and crystalline air were perfect. We were thrilled to finally get up to the snow – now that we had some – and see it before it melted.

On the trip several things stood out. We saw very few people (compared to the past). There was a wide variety of homes, cabins, and land empty and for sale. Everywhere we stopped we were over charged. A simple hamburger, not even a cheese burger, a la carte, was \$8.75. Most of the families we noticed were grand parents and grandkids, very few college-age or middle-aged people anywhere.

It must be hard to live in the mountains these days. Gas prices alone would force people to live closer to where they work, leaving who? Retirees and government salaried people? A few bold entrepreneurs with small businesses?

As a Mason and certainly as Master of a Lodge, I am well aware, in fact, intensely aware of our motto – "Brotherly love, relief, and truth". The underlying assumption is that once one becomes a Mason he now is capable of brotherly love, now has extra to give for relief to others, and now suddenly has the power and audacity of Truth. At nearly every street corner in town and now nearly every other time I get out of my vehicle, I feel the pang of someone in need asking for help, for lose change, anything, Although I know it isn't true, I feel them intensely staring at the emblem of the Square and Compass on my truck and I am piqued by the look in their eye, and their unspoken words being formed by my own guilt "You are a Mason? Why aren't you giving me something? It's your DUTY to HELP ME!" I am sure that all Masons can relate to this experience.

Here, now, as we come into the blossom of spring and the newness of all things green, I want to explore the above issues and my personal journey with the concepts to one of exasperation and frustration toward responsibility.

Brotherly love is not necessarily simply affection for one's fellow Masons. Indeed one might not "feel" that at all, just as they may not feel love for their own blood brother. And just as one doesn't get to choose their blood-brother, they really don't have much more choice in who their Masonic brothers are. So brotherly love is more of a position statement, one of being accepted into a society, kin to moving to a new country. As a Mason we now have the ability and opportunity to learn the ways and mores, rules and taboos of our new society, to better fit in and the better to enable us to "work without contention" and looking for the path where we "best agree". It goes toward an attitude conducive to cooperativeness and harmony. The benefits of this are most realized by coming to the lodge and lodge events and interacting with the "brethren".

Relief is most frequently translated as giving. Relief means in fact, easing of pain, the lessening of oppression, loosening of bondage. There are several underlying assumptions regarding relief. The first and most obvious is simply that if in fact it is a Masonic duty to provide it, then we must be able to do so. Whether we as an individual recognize it or not, we are completely able to provide relief. In the new age vernacular this is often simplified as you always have something to give. So what is it we always have to give? When we owe 13 people money, are looking at losing our job, home, etc and someone comes up and asks for a "gift", what do we always have? How can we give relief? We always, always can give a word of praise, of encouragement, kindness.

I will never forget as a young man living on my own I was completely down on my luck, no job, no income, savings gone, facing eviction, even my few friends were avoiding me.

In desperate humiliation one evening I plucked up the courage to call my grandfather who was a wealthy man. Finally after a bit of small talk I asked him if he could send me \$600. He was silent for a long moment and then said, "All the High's have done really well – until now." I was devastated. Within a moment I went through the full gamut of embarrassment, rage, anger, pain, and tears, then slowly started to weakly chuckle. "You think I can make it?", I asked. "I know you can. You are a High. Call me again in 6 months."And he hung up.

Was he cold hearted? A scrooge? Indeed the old coot was! \$600 was chump change to him. He could have sent me the money. But the "relief" he provided me was to prove far better. With my newborn pride and dignity, and the conviction that gramps believed I could do it, I weathered the storm. Although I was evicted, and lived in my car for several months, I got a new job and made better choices. After the 6 months, I called gramps and he offered to give me the down payment for my own house. I smiled and turned it down "I think I can handle it now. I am a High, after all."

I offer this personal story not as a "rags-to-riches" tale (which it is not!) but one of example. The elder High gave me RELIEF, a lessening of my pain, a loosening of my sense of bondage, his words struck like a sword at the tyranny of my root problem, a sense of failure and hopelessness. This is something we can give to others through OUR words, our encouragement, through our votes at the polls and the choices we make daily.

Relief also implies that we may need relief. And this may tie in with Truth. Truth means more than simply telling the truth. It can mean dispelling of illusion. Fears, worries, the cares, concerns, and perceptions of others can dog-pile us and nearly obliterate the truth. At such times we lose our footing and find ourselves on the precipice of making really bad choices – or even already did. At such times we need to stop and seek relief. A simple call to a Masonic brother (who is further down the road) or a close friend will do "Things are really dark. Give me a good word, brother" Then is the time for truth. "....whisper good counsel in his ear, gently admonishing him of his errors and in the most friendly manner endeavor to bring about a reformation".

So, by examining the precepts of our motto, by incorporating them slowly and daily what do we gain? We gain a more harmonious network of friends and brothers, we retain our dignity, and we become more capable in restraining panic and the poor choices that follow it. And in doing so, we provide more value to those around us and in our various endeavors. We do indeed become better men.
