On this last Father's Day, Dan Eckland, our Master in 1976 passed away. Brother Dan started his year as Master with the bicentennial bald eagle emblem on the front of his installation program as well as on the front page of every edition of the Las Palmian. Dan

also brought this theme into the Lodge Room for when he sat in the East, he did not wear the usual top hat, he wore, with permission from Grand

Lodge, a tri-corn hat.

Brother Dan organized a combined bicentennial and public schools program for the April Stated Meeting. Students from Starr Elementary School put on a play entitled "We Must Be Free." On July 3, there was a bicentennial parade in downtown Fresno






and there was a float that had been built by the brethren. Las Palmas's Wally Scott was on that float dressed as patriot wearing his Masonic Apron.

We have Music!!!, Robert P. Gonzalez was installed as Organist for Las Palmas-Ponderosa Lodge No. 366












