PROCLAMATION

MASONIC HOMES ENDOWMENT MONTH

The true happiness we have is that we share with others, and no virtue is greater than that of sharing — the precious gift of charity. Each degree in Masonry teaches that lesson, and the Holy Scriptures provide us with countless examples of charity as guides for abundant living.

Our greatest Masonic charity in California is for our Homes in Covina and Decoto. The residents there are our charges, and we wish for them the best care that we can provide. Rising costs of that service and depreciated money are taking their toll in meeting our obligations to the children at Covina and the elderly at Decoto. Outside cases for relief also are substantially increasing the need for relief funds.

At the present time we have collected only about half the amount we need if we are to top last year's contributions in excess of one million dollars. Our task is great, but we can meet the challenge if each of us will help. Now is the time to act.

I, therefore, proclaim the month of May 1976 to be

"Masonic Homes Endowment Month"

and request that this proclamation be read at the April and May Stated Meetings of all Lodges in California and Hawaii. Wherever practicable, send a copy of this proclamation to each member of the Lodge.
