

The California Masonic Code provides, that individual lodges may provide for availability of life memberships for their members (S.2804). Not all lodges in Fresno have life memberships, but Las Palmas does. By Masonic Law, a life membership costs 21 times the annual dues. No adjustment is made for a member's age. The current cost therefore, of a life membership of Las Palmas is \$525.

If you were at the October stated meeting, you heard read the resolution to increase our

dues to \$30.00. This increase is necessary in a large part to inflation and to a marked increase in Grand Lodge per capita assessment. The new assessment is \$5.00 which leaves our lodge only \$20.00 per member to operate on.

Las Palmas is fortunate to have many young members. For these young members a life membership is a great investment. If you can now swing a \$525 payment you will become a life member of our lodge, and equally important you will be giving Las Palmas funds which will be kept safe forever in trust with only the interest thereon to be used.

The time to buy your life membership is now, not tomorrow, but today. If you wait until the first of the year it will cost you an extra \$105.00.

Discuss this excellent investment with your family and I'm sure you will be able to find the money. Since you will not have to pay the increase in dues for 1979, the net cost will be only \$495. Usually the dues bills for next year are mailed to the members around the first week in November. This year will be an exception. The Lodge is not able to care for all its financial obligations on the dues now being paid, so the Finance Committee has proposed a change in our By-Laws to raise the annual dues to \$30.00.

In order to make the necessary changes the proposal is submitted to the lodge at a stated meeting (in this case October) and voted on at the next stated meeting (November) which

will be November 16.

In order not to make any errors in the reminders we send out we have been advised by the Grand Secretary to wait until after a vote has been taken before we send out the mail. Please look for a special mailing of the dues reminders soon after our November stated meeting. Those who have already paid their 1979 dues will be billed an extra \$5.00 to cover the additional amount if the vote is favorable.

We would like to remind those who come to our stated meeting dinners that reservations for the meals close Wednesday noon. By this time Mary Perch has already ordered the food so it will be here Thursday morning when the ladies show up to prepare it. By time of the deadline everyone should know if they can come or not. We plead with you, don't phone for reservations or cancellations (unless emergency) after Wednesday noon.

This request is not too harsh. Just imagine yourself trying to prepare a meal for around 200 people and receive phone calls while you are preparing it for additional reservations. Quite a few times the ladies have had to order additional food and prepare it separately for our late comers. Usually the late people are ones who have never volunteered to help with the meals and are not aware of what turmoil they are causing.

Please plan ahead a day or so. This is always a good habit to form. It will help our Dates and will give you a sense of satisfaction to know there will be a seat waiting for you when you come to dinner.

Brother Jim Blaine, superintendent of the Masonic Home for Children at Covina, brought some information to Grand Lodge. He says the name of the trees in front of the Home is Silk Floss (pink). There are several other colors to be had also. The trees he refers to are the ones that had those beautiful orchid flowers, that those of us who were there on our last trip wondered about.
