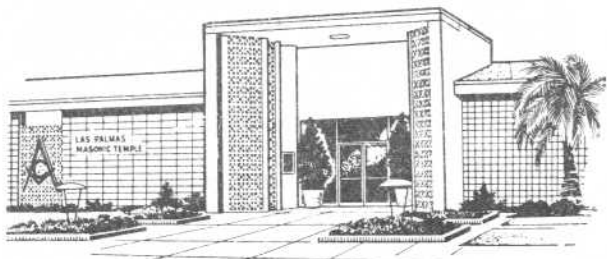

PUBLIC SCHOOLS MONTH — APRIL, 1979
To: All Masonic Lodges in California and Hawaii.

Dear Brethren:

Public Schools: Assignment with Destiny"

That is the rallying cry among Masons this year, and indeed our Public Schools have an assignment with destiny. Never have the problems facing our teachers, administrators, students and parents been more critical or volatile.

It has been said that if we work upon marble, it will perish; if on brass, time will efface it; but, if we work upon immortal minds and imbue them with principles, with the just fear of God and love of our fellow-men, we will engrave on those tablets something that will brighten to all eternity.

The sure foundations of this Nation are laid in knowledge, not in ignorance. Not only knowledge of the recorded wisdom of the experience of mankind but, also, feelings are to be disciplined, passions restrained, true and worthy motives inspired, profound religious feelings instilled and pure morality inculcated.

To assist in this dynamic process is the duty and privilege of every Mason, at his own particular level of effectiveness, but always with a steady and unselfish willingness of heart.
