

From the Secretary

We feel it may be necessary to pass out a little information to our members concerning applications for degrees and for affiliation. Some have been coming into the office incomplete.



The candidate's name must be in full. Middle initials will not do the job. The application form on line 1 specifically says IN FULL. The Masonic Code states that an application will not be accepted unless it is filled out completely.

Our next problem is the address of the candidate. He must include his zip code in his address or it is not complete. We recently had a form which had no zip code and it was too new to be in the Fresno Zip Code Directory.

Line 7 is for the applicant's occupation. Occasionally we get the place where he works but not what he does there. The name of the firm does not always tell us what he does.

The application must be signed by two members of Las Palmas Lodge and in their own handwriting. Master Masons of other lodges cannot sign for applicants for degrees in our lodge. The references may be filled in by the candidate and can be almost anyone we can contact. This does not include friends who live out of town. All recommendors and references must have zip codes in their addresses or the form will not be considered complete.

Applications should be in the lodge office at least a day or so before our stated meeting in order to allow time for checking. If we get them the day of the meeting and find something wrong or omitted, there will not be time enough to get it right before the meeting, and will have to lay over for another month before being presented to the lodge. Sometimes the candidate does

not understand why it takes so long for the lodge to act.

If you see a man who will make a good member you may approach him with the question of "Have you ever thought about joining a masonic lodge?" In this way you are not asking him to join, but just giving him an opening to ask for a petition for membership. You may even tell him that he can't be asked to join but he must ask to join. Keep those applications coming.
