WHAT'S IN A NAME?

Meet the man with the "Most Masonic Name"—Hiram Abiff Boaz Methodist Bishop, Little Rock, Ark.

When he became superintendent of Southern Methodist missions in the Orient, Shanghai Masons invited him to speak in their Lodge.

How did he get the Masonic name?

He doubts that his father was a member of the Craft. He says he was surprised when he was made a Mason to learn the cause for all the curious stares from Masons as he signed hotel registers, etc.

When he was raised it was the first time in Masonic history a Hiram Abiff Boaz had been exalted to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason.

Bishop Boaz virtually founded Southern Methodist University. He has many an enlightening tales about his unusual name, including the time

he was admitted to a great Mosque in the Holy Land by merely telling the keeper his full name.

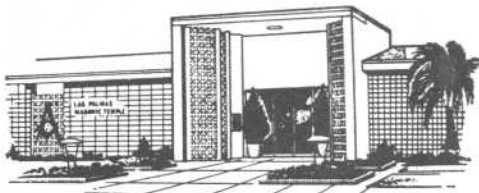
