From the South:

Greetings Brethren,

To my friends and brothers' greetings and salutations from Las Palmas-Ponderosa lodge. Tumbling COVID-19 case counts have some schools around the U.S. considering relaxing their mask rules, but deaths nationally have been ticking up over the past few weeks, some rural hospitals are showing signs of strain, and cold weather is setting in.

The number of new cases nationally has been plummeting since the delta surge peaked in mid-September. The U.S. is averaging about 73,000 new cases per day, less than half of the nearly 173,000 recorded on Sept. 13. And the number of Americans in the hospital with COVID-19 has plummeted by about half to around 47,000 since early September.

Las Palmas can remain open with in person meetings and normal Lodge business as we continue to exercise preventative measures to avoid contracting the virus, as cases of COVID are rising again among the vaccinated. As always please look out for those in need. Continue social distancing measures in the interests of keeping everyone healthy and safe. We have a First Degree coming up Nov 11th so I look forward to seeing everyone in Lodge.

May the blessing of heaven rest upon us and all our loved ones.



From the Archives:



In January of 1981, Brother Gary Starr was installed as the 77th Master of Las Palmas Lodge. Jim Kleinknight was our new Sr. Warden and Eldon Cole was Jr. Warden. To me this seems like it was just yesterday. Actually, it was 40 years ago.

A lot has happened in those 40 years, especially with Masonry. I am afraid that most of what has happened to Masonry has not been for the best. If Ponderosa and Clovis Lodge had not consolidated with Las Palmas, the current membership of Las Palmas would only be about 20% of what it was just 40 years ago. Back then, our newly initiated candidates eagerly learned their work and we heard candidate proficiencies several times each month. We had sufficient candidates to hold degrees just about every Thursday night except for our Stated Meetings. Lodges all over the United States are now having problems with candidates learning their proficiencies. In some jurisdiction, proficiencies are no longer required. I hope that never happens in California.

Attendance at Lodge meetings was somewhat better than today but just about every issue of the Las Palmian had some officer pleading for members to attend a meeting. Our Lodge was filled to capacity at our installations. The Fresno-Clovis area had a total of 6 Masonic Lodges and today we have only 2. Our Grand Lodge has made some effort to solve the problem of candidates not wanting to spend the time and effort to learn their work. The candidate proficiency has been substantially reduced in length. There are two problems with this. If a newly raised Master Mason wants to become an officer, he has to learn the long form 3rd degree proficiency as well as much of what he should have learned in the long form proficiencies for the 1st and 2nd degrees. Thus, we do not have a good pool of potential officers to keep our Lodges alive and well.



On May 21, 1981, Bro Bill Wharton received the Hiram Award from Las Palmas Lodge. I am sure that some of you will remember Bro Bill. He was a true masonic scholar and regularly gave talks to our candidates about the history of masonry and how it applied to Masons today. Bro Bill was also our Treasurer for many years.

In July, Bro George Posson PM got the ash wood and Bro. Ed Carpenter PM made the picture frames for our Past Masters in our club room. In 2015, I purchased more ash wood and together with a friend made the picture frames for all of the Past Masters of Clovis Lodge.

Ten Master Masons, happy, doing fine;
One listened to a rumor, then there were nine.

Nine Master Masons, faithful, never late;
One didn't like the "Master," then there were eight.

Eight Master Masons, on their way to heaven;
One joined to many clubs, then there were seven.
