In desperate humiliation one evening I plucked up the courage to call my grandfather who was a wealthy man. Finally after a bit of small talk I asked him if he could send me \$600. He was silent for a long moment and then said, "All the High's have done really well – until now." I was devastated. Within a moment I went through the full gamut of embarrassment, rage, anger, pain, and tears, then slowly started to weakly chuckle. "You think I can make it?", I asked. "I know you can. You are a High. Call me again in 6 months."And he hung up.

Was he cold hearted? A scrooge? Indeed the old coot was! \$600 was

chump change to him. He could have sent me the money. But the "relief" he provided me was to prove far better. With my newborn pride and dignity, and the conviction that gramps believed I could do it, I weathered the storm. Although I was evicted, and lived in my car for several months, I got a new job and made better choices. After the 6 months, I called gramps and he offered to give me the down payment for my own house. I smiled and turned it down "I think I can handle it now. I am a High, after all."

I offer this personal story not as a "rags-to-riches" tale (which it is not!) but one of example. The elder High gave me RELIEF, a lessening of my pain, a loosening of my sense of bondage, his words struck like a sword at the tyranny of my root problem, a sense of failure and hopelessness. This is something we can give to others through OUR words, our encouragement, through our votes at the polls and the choices we make daily.

Relief also implies that we may need relief. And this may tie in with Truth. Truth means more than simply telling the truth. It can mean dispelling of illusion. Fears, worries, the cares, concerns, and perceptions of others can dog-pile us and nearly obliterate the truth.

At such times we lose our footing and find ourselves on the precipice of making really bad choices – or even already did. At such times we need to stop and seek relief. A simple call to a Masonic brother (who is further down the road) or a close friend will do "Things are really dark. Give me a good word, brother" Then is the time for truth. "....whisper good counsel in his ear, gently admonishing him of his errors and in the most friendly manner endeavor to bring about a reformation".

So, by examining the precepts of our motto, by incorporating them slowly and daily what do we gain? We gain a more harmonious network of friends and brothers, we retain our dignity, and we become more capable in restraining panic and the poor choices that follow it. And in doing so, we provide more value to those around us and in our various endeavors. We do indeed become better men.

History from the Past;

Last month I asked if anyone knew what major expense, other than rent, Las Palmas Lodge had each month during its infancy. Brother Curtis Jack sent an e-mail to our Secretary with the correct answer: cigars. For the first 25+ years of our existence, it was common for the Lodge to spend \$12 to \$15 per month. At that time a box of cigars cost \$3 and if a box contained 20, the Lodge Hall must have been really smelled of cigar smoke.

The idea of starting the second Masonic Lodge in Fresno came about in late 1904 when 15 local Masons met at the home of James Cyrus Pottle. At their second meeting on December 16, they signed a petition asking the Grand Master to grant them a dispensation so that they could form Las Palmas Lodge. The dispensation was granted in early 1905 and the Lodge, under dispensation, was so successful that at the annual communication of Grand Lodge that October, a Charter was granted.

The 15 Masons that are our Charter Members are:

James Cyrus Pottle, a local merchant who was a Past Master of Sanger Lodge and Inspector. He would be our first Master in 1905 while under dispensation.

Elliott William Lindsay, the County Superintendent of Schools and member of Fresno Lodge. **Joseph Philip Bernhard**, a local attorney and member of Fresno Lodge. He would be our Master in 1907.

William Angus Sutherland, a local attorney and banker and member of Fresno Lodge. He would be our Master in 1909.

Herbert Z. Austin, a local Judge and member of Fresno Lodge. He would be our Master in 1908. **John Simeon Jones**, a farmer and capitalist and member of Reedley Lodge.

Alexander Marion Drew, a local attorney, state assemblyman, and member of Fresno Lodge.

Albert Bazzle Clark, a local banker and member of Reedley Lodge. He would be our Master in 1906. **John Quincy Anderson**, a local realtor and member of Fresno Lodge.

Charles Sheldon Pierce, a lumberman and member of Fresno Lodge.

Briceno Amendez Fassett, a local "agent" and a past master of Hanford Lodge.

William Oscar Miles, The Fresno County Clerk and a member of Fresno Lodge.

Duncan Donald Allison, an ice merchant and member of Fresno Lodge and their Master in 1895. Bro. Allison was our Funeral Master for many years.

Albert Graves Wishon, the founder and owner of San Joaquin Light and Power Co. who was a member of Visalia Lodge.

Charles Lewis Walter, a local Real Estate agent and member of Selma Lodge.

When these 15 Masons signed the bylaws of Las Palmas Lodge as charter members, their membership in their previous lodge was automatically terminated.

We started with only 15 members in early 1905, how many members do you think we had when we received our Charter in October of 1905?
