From the West,

For the last two months on every Monday night, we have had a coaching session at our Lodge. Attendance has been up and down. When I started this, I expected that some of our Entered Apprentice brothers would be the only ones desiring to be coached. Happily, I was wrong. We have had a Fellow Craft and several Master Masons attend. These informal coaching sessions also let us spend time together outside of the Lodge room and get to know each other better.

Because we had over 35 Entered Apprentice Masons and a handful of Fellow Carfts who had never advanced, my goal was to get them coached so they could advance and eventually be raised Master Masons. Out of this group, our secretary has sent out delinquent dues notices to eighteen EA and FC brothers who, if they do not pay up, will be suspended at our May Stated Meeting.

Our next decision will concern the remaining six EA's and FC's who are current with their dues through 2024 and have not advanced within 3 years of being initiated or, are not being currently coached. California Masonic Code §804.690 "...provides that if a candidate does not present himself qualified for the Fellow Craft and Master Mason Degrees within a period of three years from the date of his initiation as an Entered Apprentice" there is a mandatory process that may result in the candidate forfeiting his fees for degrees if he does not get coached and advanced. If this happens, he must reapply to the Lodge for his remaining degrees and be subject to vote of the Lodge for this privilege of being coached and advanced.

If you are an Entered Apprentice or Fellow Craft who was initiated as an Entered Apprentice Mason prior to March of 2022, and is not being actively coached, you should contact either Bryan our Lodge Secretary, or me. I can be reached at <u>LasPalmasLodge@currently.com</u>

From the Archives:

In the process of scanning all of the Las Palmas Lodge minutes of meetings, I am currently working on the minutes from the 1920's. As I scan them, I also get a chance to glance at what was taking place during the Roaring Twenties after WW I.

At our November, 1920 Stated Meeting the following resolution was read:

A petition signed by twelve Master Masons
requesting this lodge to recommend to the Grand
Master that a charter be granted for the purpose
of forming a new lodge was read and on motion the
W. M. was authorized to appoint a committee to
investigate the matter.

At our December Stated Meeting the following appears in our Minutes.

The Committee appointed on the Petition for the formation of another Masonic Lodge in the City of Fresnoreported unfavorable and on motion the report of the Committee was unanimously adopted.

The Committee must have changed their minds as in 1922 Sun Garden Lodge No. 530 was formed.

Today our main source of revenue comes in the form of dues from our members. Back in the 1920's this was not the case. In January of 1920 dues received were \$888.00 (You could pay them quarterly then if you so desired.) Fees for degrees received were \$1,140.00. At this time Las Palmas Lodge was in the process of increasing the fees for the degrees to \$100. In today's dollars it would be over \$1,600.

I have no way of knowing exactly what the candidates' proficiencies consisted of in the 1920's, but I imagine that it was similar to what we have today. My Uncle Ray Frey was initiated on May 26, 1927 and gave his 1st degree candidates proficiency in open Lodge on June 16. Later in the year he was passed to a Fellow Craft and one week later he gave his 2nd degree proficiency. If we didn't have TV, cell phones or internet today, I wonder how fast our current candidates would learn their proficiencies.
