
Please plan to attend our upcoming stated meeting, as I will be appointing members to our Management Board.

#### From the West,

For as far back as I remember, the first Trestle board message from a newly installed Sr. Warden is to thank the brethren for electing him as our Senior Warden. Unfortunately, I can not say that in this, my first Trestle board message as the newly installed Sr. Warden.

I was Master in 1980 and have been active in the affairs of Las Palmas-Ponderosa Lodge for many decades. I have happily filled in for an officer who was vacant for a meeting. If I was lucky, all of the officers were present and I got to sit as a sideliner and enjoy the degree. When our Officer's Coach Chuck Bersani passed away in June, Worshipful Bill Lyons asked if I would be our Officer's Coach and was so appointed by our inspector.

When we had our annual election of officers this last November, I saw that we had two officers who had worked themselves up through the chairs to be our Sr. Deacon and Master. At my urging, Josh Harmon PM agreed to be Jr. Warden even though he was elected to that position last year, but was never installed as Jr. Warden. Unfortunately, we had no officers in the line or Past Masters who offered to be Sr. Warden. Did I want to be the Sr. Warden, not really, I just wanted to be the Officer's Coach and Lodge Trustee.

I also knew that without an installed Sr. Warden and Jr. Warden, Las Palmas-Ponderosa Lodge would soon have to close up shop and our only option would be to find some other lodge to allow us to consolidate with them. I did not like the thought of that, and I am sure that most, if not all of you, do not like that thought either. I reluctantly agreed to be the Sr. Warden and be qualified by our inspector to keep Las Palmas-Ponderosa Lodge a viable Lodge. But this does not provide any kind of a solution to the problem. We need members and Past Masters to step up, attend your Lodge regularly and become a qualified officer, **and do it now**, not at some future date which may never happen.

It takes years for a new member to learn all three of his proficiencies, and then learn the ritual and floor work before he can be a Sr. Deacon, Warden or Master. We currently have 35 Entered Apprentice Masons who are mostly not being coached. We also have 6 Fellow Craft Masons who are not being coached. Of course, some of these brothers have given up on Masonry for various reasons and if they do not pay their dues for two years, we can drop them, but we hope that some of them will decide to put Masonry back in their lives so we have not suspended all that we could for NPD. The cost of special postage to drop someone for non-payment of dues is an expense to the Lodge and the payment of the Grand Lodge assessment for a NPD member is a major expense for the Lodge. Even with the cypher that our Grand Lodge has published, there are actually very few of our members who are willing or able to teach an Entered Apprentice his proficiency.

As the Sr. Warden, I am responsible for the candidates learning their work. To facilitate this, I am starting an evening every week for our candidates to come to Lodge and get coached. The first evening will be Monday February 3 at 7:00 pm. These sessions will continue every Monday, except for holidays. We will try to contact all of our Entered Apprentice and Fellowcraft Masons and let them know about these Monday evening sessions, but if you signed a petition and your candidate has not completed his proficiency, I ask you to contact him and encourage him to show up on Monday evenings. Of course, you are also welcome to join him. If you are unsure if your candidate is being coached, please send me an e-mail so I can get back to you.

#### From the Archives:

If you watched the Vice President, take his oath of office on January 20<sup>th</sup>, you may have noticed that much of the wording should be very familiar to Masons. The story behind this oath is that it was adopted by our first Congress and is still being used today.

"I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties of the office on which I am about to enter. So help me God."

There must have been many Masons in our first Congress.

I am getting ready to have all of the old minutes of Las Palmas Lodge scanned so they can be stored on the cloud and available to all of our members and saved in perpetuity. In neither the 1913 nor 1914 minutes, was there any indication of the election of officers nor the installation of the officers. The minutes just reflected the names of the officers who were present for a meeting. Starting in January of 1915, the minutes state that Las Palmas and Fresno Lodge held a joint installation of officers.

At our February 7, 1980 meeting I told the brethren: "There will be a reception for the Grand Master at the Fairgrounds on Saturday, May 3." Back then, when the Grand Master came to Fresno for his annual reception, there were so many people in attendance that neither the Las Palmas Temple nor the Fresno Lodge Temple had a room large enough to hold everybody. Instead, we would rent a building such as the Fairgrounds. I remember one of these functions where local Masons, who were musicians, formed a band with more than 20 members. The music was fantastic.

Our Secretary, Bob Paden, read an invitation to attend the Royal Arch installation Saturday, February 9<sup>th</sup>. It was noted that five of our members would fill various offices positions for 1980.

At the 3<sup>rd</sup> degree for Louis Putney on February 14<sup>th</sup>, Larry Duba delivered the charge. On September 29<sup>th</sup>, 2023, Brother Duba delivered a fine first-degree charge when his son-in-law and the husband of his granddaughter were initiated. I have asked Brother Duba to deliver the charge at future first degrees.
