
From the West,

On my birthday several weeks ago, I got a Happy Birthday e-mail from our Grand Lodge. Besides wishing me a Happy Birthday, it suggested that I click on a link to open up my account on the GL website, which I did.

To my surprise there was a pie chart with the age of member statistics for Las Palmas lodge. In the largest group, were those members over 80 years of age; there are 83 members. In the next largest group, age 70 -79, we have 78 members. For the 60 to 69 age group, we have 39 members. There are 49 members in the 50-59 bracket and 38 in the 40-49 bracket and only 24 in the 30-39 age bracket.

While these statistics are probably similar for most Masonic Lodges in California, and perhaps in the United States, the numbers are alarming. Over 50% of our members in Las Palmas Lodge are now over age 70.

When I petitioned Las Palms Lodge in 1967, you had to be age 21 before you could petition a Lodge in California. Subsequently, this was changed to age 18 and at our February Stated Meeting we favorably voted on the petition of a man who was only 20 years old.



In my February Sr. Warden message to you, I said that I would be starting a coaching session for our candidates every Monday evening at 7:00. In order to get the word out about these coaching sessions, Brother John Wilson and I attempted to personally contact every one of our 36 Entered Apprentice and 6 Fellow Craft Masons. We personally made a phone call to everyone on our list for whom we had a valid phone number. A couple answered the phone directly and a few more returned our calls. Most, by far the greatest majority, never responded.

I then sent out personal e-mails to those whom we were not able to contact by phone and got a total of 3 e-mail responses and one phone response. When I got a reply that the e-mail address was no longer valid, I personally mailed a letter to these 5 or 6 Entered Apprentice Masons. Again, no replies to me.

Of those who did reply, one met with me at the Lodge and asked what his options were as he no longer wanted to be in Masonry. Since he was paid up on his dues, I suggested that he ask for a Demit, which he did.

3 EA's wanted to be suspended for non-payment of dues. NPD

2 FC's wanted to be suspended for NPD

7 said that they would be there on Monday night, but only 3 showed up.

2 wanted to be coached over the phone as they were living out of state, but agreed to come back to Fresno to give their proficiencies and get their FC and MM degrees.

2 said that they were moving

1 said that due to family matters he wanted to wait until April before he decided if he wanted to proceed. He had a Life Membership which was given to him by his father many years ago.

21 did not respond in any manner

On our first Monday, February 3^{rd} , coaching session we had a total of 3 EA's, 1 FC and one MM show up.

On our second Monday night, February 10^{th} , we had 1 EA, 1 FC and 1 MM show up.

On our third Monday night, February 17th, we had 1 EA and 1 FC.

On our last Monday for February, we had 1 EA and 2 MM's. I was also notified, in advance, that two of our EA could not make it due to work related matters.

We will continue these Monday night coaching sessions with the hope that more will show up and get coached so that we can eventually make more Master Masons in our Lodge.

I submitted a list of names to our Secretary that 17 EA's who failed to respond, or asked, be suspended for NPD. This list also included 2 FC's to be suspended for NPD. In addition, I asked that the two who are current be granted their wish for a demit.

From the Archives:

At our stated meeting on February 21^{st,} 1980, my birthday, I, as Master, read a written memorial for two of our members. These memorials were then placed in the Lodge minutes with a copy being sent to the family of the fallen Brother. This is a photocopy of the memorial for RALPH WILLIAM BOUCHER, age 85, passed to the Celestial Lodge Above on

Wednesday, February 20, after a long series of illnesses. In his earlier years Ralph was very active in masonic organizations, especially the Shrine. He was born in Murphysboro, Illinois on June 19, 1894 and was in the U.S. Army during World War I, after which he was a salesman for Hobbs Parsons Co., a local produce firm. Later he and his wife, Mary, operated a flower shop on Fulton Street in downtown Fresno, which they later sold to Phil Lewis. Bro. Boucher was raised in Las Palmas Lodge June 20, 1928, and received his Golden Veteran Award on July 20, 1977.

The irony of this memorial is not that I ever met Brother Boucher, but his flower shop was across the street from my father's business on Van Ness in downtown Fresno. Brother Lewis then moved his flower shop to Ashlan and Fresno Street which was close to where we lived in 1973. Bro Phil Lewis appointed me to the officer's line when he was Master in 1973 and taught me all of the ritual for the Master Mason degree as the 3rd degree Officer Coach for Las Palmas. On most Saturday's I would go over to Bro Phil's shop and talk to him and his wife Evie. Before I could leave, he had to give me a bouquet of flowers to take home to Therese. These not only pleased Therese, but all of the women who would see me walking to our apartment in the complex would get jealous because they would have loved to have had their husbands bring them flowers weekly from a florist.

Personally, I like the idea of having a committee prepare a written memorial for a fallen brother so that it can begiven to his family, read in open Lodge and then placed in the Lodge Minutes.

On March 13, at 7:30 p.m., Bethel 243 conducted the Jobs Daughters ritual. Wives of Master Masons were invited (no pant suits or slacks). On April 3, at 7:30 p.m. Las Palmas DeMolay put on the DeMolay degree for us. On April 24, at 7:30 p.m. Rainbow for Girls exemplify their ritual (only wives of Master Masons who are members of the Order of Eastern Star or are senior member of Rainbow could visit with us).


